Wolters, Albert M. *Creation Regained: Biblical Basics for a Reformational Worldview*. 2nd ed. Grand Rapids, MI: Wm. B. Eerdmans Publishing Company, 2005.

This was our primary source. Wolters follows the creation-fall-redemption approach.

Anderson, James N. *What's Your Worldview? An interactive approach to life's big questions*. Wheaton, IL: Crossway, 2014.

This book is written like a “choose your own adventure” book. Anderson is a professor at RTS Charlotte.

Ryken, Philip Graham. *What Is the Christian Worldview? (Basics of the Reformed Faith)*. P & R Publishing, 2006.

This booklet is in the Basics of the Faith series (originally called Basics of the Reformed Faith, but I think they decided to drop “reformed”). The whole series is worthwhile, and each booklet asks a question about some aspect of the Christian faith. Ryken follows the same outline as Wolters, except he adds the final stage (Glory: Paradise Consummated) which Wolters omits because, well, once we get there, we won’t need a worldview class.
